My Years in New Jersey Politics
Joan Waks, Esq.

Joan Waks, Esq., a member of the League of Women Voters, will speak about her many years in New Jersey politics at the September 19 meeting of the American Association of University Women (AAUW). Ms. Waks served on the Wayne Democratic County Committee for over 30 years. She served as Wayne Councilwoman-at-large for four years, and Wayne Democratic Municipal Leader for five years. She was a candidate for Passaic County Freeholder in 1991 and 1992, and was a candidate for New Jersey Assembly in 1985 and New Jersey Senate in 1987. Ms. Waks is a founder of the law firm Waks and Mecky with offices in Wayne, NJ, which focuses on family law.

History of Women in Volunteerism in NJ
Patricia (Patty) S.Whitehouse

Patty, a retired Chubb and Son Vice President, is a certified executive and life coach, public speaker and workshop facilitator. Patty is a member of the International Coach Federation and the New Jersey Professional Coaches Association. She successfully completed "The Senior Leadership Program" at the Rutgers Institute for Women's Leadership, and has remained connected with the program as a panelist and guest speaker. For a number of years, she has coached high-potential, working women professionals as a mentor with WOMEN Unlimited, Inc. Patty also served the General Federation of Women's Clubs as a Mentor, coaching Federation members throughout the country on membership-related issues.

In addition to serving as the State President of the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs (NJSFWC), Patty has served the organization in a number of other Board positions, including the Legislation/Resolutions Chairman. Currently, Patty serves on the General Federation of Women's Clubs' (GFWC) Board of Directors as the Communications and Public Relations Chairman and she is the President of the Peapack-Gladstone Woman's Club. Patty is also a newly selected member of the Women Aware Board of Directors. Women Aware is the Middlesex County domestic violence agency.

Patty was named a 2012 Garden State Woman of the Year for Women's Initiatives in the Non-Profit arena and received the Charlotte Emerson Brown Award for Excellence in State Leadership from the General Federation of Women's Clubs at the 2012 GFWC International Convention in Charlotte, NC.
