Wednesday, January 16, 2013

2012 was the 65th anniversary of Bea Kettlewood's graduation from Butler High School with a line from the alma mater, "undaunted we will strive anew." At Newark State, etched in stone over the door was, "who dares to teach must never cease to learn." This year, 2012, Bea set goals for herself to make even numbers: finish 400 oil paintings and 1300 watercolors. She met those goals and has done 401 oils and 1304 watercolors. One watercolor, 11" x 16", was done during Sandy's power outage lighted by two flashlights and a small Coleman lamp. As of this year, Bea has had 53 solo shows and has exhibited in 10 states; the Penn State show was number 52. Penn State now has the Be3a Card Kettlewood Endowment designated specifically for art education.

During Bea's talk, she will show that no matter how gray and white winter is, it will eventually be summer with pinks, yellows and greens. BCK will show what artists did with those summer colors.

Joan Meechee, a 2012 recipient of our AAUW branch scholarship will be speaking at the February meeting. Ms Meechee will speak about her experiences with "Healing the Children" in the Dominican Republic and also about her experiences as a mature woman returning to college.



Joan Meechee works in her current profession as an operating room nurse at Surgicare in Oradell, NJ. In December 2000 she graduated from Bergen Community College with an ASN in nursing and is currently attending College of St. Elizabeth to obtain a BSN in nursing. Joan has been helping people in the medical field since she was 18 years old but her desire to give more of herself by serving others is the result of the family cloth from which she is cut. In 2003 she joined Dr. Avella and Healing the Children on a spiritual and rewarding medical mission to the Dominican Republic that would give her such depth of understanding about service beyond self on a global level, that it would change the course of her life's mission forever.
