Scholarship

Your Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce that we have two winners for our AAUW Greater Wayne Area Scholarship—Mayra Cabrera from Ramapo College and Omowunmi Adedeji from Rutgers University. Both candidates impressed the committee with their determination to continue their education despite tremendous odds.

Mayra, a resident of Ringwood, is pursuing a future career in education. She notes, "When I obtain my degree and become a professional, I will be the first person to graduate from college in my family." Mayra is a single parent, juggling her time between taking 12 credits at Ramapo College, working 38-40 hours per week at a pharmacy, raising her daughter and maintaining an above average GPA. She attended Fiorella LaGuardia Community College, NY, prior to attending Ramapo. Mayra anticipates graduating with her bachelor's degree in 2016.

Omowunmi, a resident of East Orange, is originally from Nigeria. She is presently pursuing a bachelor's degree in biological sciences at Rutgers University and plans a future career as an MD specializing in obstetrics and gynecology. She notes that, growing up, she experienced women "living in deplorable3 conditions" and understood "what it means to see a crying mother cradling a dead baby in the street after giving birth without any form of medical attention or assistance." She overcame many obstacles in coming to the US and remaining here to pursue her dreams. She notes, "I remained dedicated to attending the classes that I knew eventually would be beneficial." Omowunmi is currently taking a rigorous premed course of study, maintains a high GHPA, and is currently on the Dean's List. She works at the University Computing Help Desk to assist in supporting her education. Omowunmi anticipates graduating with her bachelor's degree in 2015.

Both these deserving women will be at our May 21 dinner to receive their scholarships, which will be \$1400 each. I know you will join the committee in giving these women the support they deserve to complete their education. Thank you all at Greater Wayne for your generous support.

In a move that AAUW has long supported, President Barack Obama signed two executive orders on April 8, Equal Pay Day, to insure pay protections for women. The protections apply to federal contractors, who make up about a quarter of the workforce. Now these employers can't retaliate against workers who share salary information, and the U.S. Department of Labor will begin to collect wage data to identify patterns of discrimination. In the absence of congressional action, the executive orders are a huge victory in the fight for fair pay.
