

Girls Hall of Fame in September.

• Nine members attended the state Annual Meeting in April at Forsgate, four members traveled to the National Convention in San Diego in May, and five members attended the state's Fall Focus Meeting in October. These members came away with increased knowledge of and commitment to AAUW's mission and goals.

• Four members attended an AAUWNJ-sponsored Women in Leadership event in November at Hoboken High School.

• Our branch received a Charitable Trust Grant for the display we mounted at the William Paterson University library. Five WPU e-affiliates joined AAUW as a direct result of the display.

Membership increased from 37 to 40.

• Our branch hosted four general meetings, one dinner, and two socials.

• The Social Concerns Committee organized drives for donated school supplies in August and holiday gifts in November.

• The Board met six times to work on our behalf.

• Our branch produced a printed Yearbook and

• Outreach to existing and new members was ongoing.

• Lunch Bunch, Lit Group, Art Group, Bridge Group and Games Night met regularly through the year for enjoyment and to promote community and fellowship among members.

Human Trafficking Awareness Day – January 11

AAUWNJ continues its very strong and active role in raising awareness about the existence of human trafficking in our own backyard – New Jersey.

Before New Jersey hosted the 2014 Super Bowl, concerned agencies banded together to work

against human trafficking and the NJ Coalition against Human Trafficking was formed. AAUWNJ became a member.

The Super Bowl and similar large gatherings draw increased trafficking into the areas surrounding the event location(s). The notoriety of the event is an opportunity to shed light on the scourge of human trafficking and its resultant effects.

Efforts were mounted to gain support for proposals for more stringent and effective anti-trafficking laws. The travel and hospitality industries became a focal point for visits from Coalition teams to advise and instruct industry members how they could actively work to identify and report signs of trafficking.

These initiatives were successful and progress was made, most notably with the signing of the New Jersey Human Trafficking Prevention, Protection and Treatment Act which is rated one of the best in the US. Although the spotlight on New Jersey is not as bright in 2016, much needs to be done because human trafficking is still a big and lucrative business.

To update your knowledge of current trafficking issues visit the Polaris <http://polarisproject. org/2015-impact> and Coalition <http://www. njhumantrafficking.org/> web sites.

To learn more about this important topic, I strongly urge you to consider attending the New Jersey Human Trafficking Summit that will be held on January 16 at Calvary Temple in Wayne. For further info about the summit see the flyer included in this newsletter.

Our AAUW Greater Wayne Area Branch is committed to supporting this crucial work so that progress fighting modern day slavery continues and awareness of the problem remains on everyone's radar.

CALL FOR 2016 GIRLS HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS

VALUABLE RECOGNITION OF GIRLS' LEADERSHIP INITIATIVES

The Greater Wayne Area Branch (GWA) of the American Association of University Women (AAUW) is a part of the renowned, highly visible national organization that works to break through barriers for women and girls by means of advocacy, education, philanthropy and research.

The purpose of the Girls Hall of Fame is to recognize and cultivate girl leaders by seeking out and awarding individuals for notable evidence of leadership, service and legacy.

Benefits of being inducted into the Girls Hall of Fame

- Endorsement of the inductee's work by the GWA Branch of AAUW, a highly regarded national women's organization.
- Publicity for the inductee, perhaps leading to local support of her ongoing project.
- Opportunity to meet and network with other girl leaders.

Qualifications for Nomination

To be eligible the nominee must:

- Attend school in Bergen, Essex, Morris, or Passaic County.
- Have completed or be pursuing an independent project with evidence of success.
- Demonstrate leadership ability in a project with ongoing lasting benefits.
- Be no more than a high school senior in the fall of 2016.
- Have no relationship to a GWA Branch member.
- Have permission from a parent or guardian to respond to a request for projectrelated information. Inductees are expected to attend the award ceremony in the fall.

We begin at 7:30 pm and play games until 10, at which time we have light refreshments.


