
The purpose of this branch shall be to further AAUW's mission to advance equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy and research.

In her letter from the Editor, Hannah Moulton Belec sets the tone for the winter 2017 issue of outlook. In her letter titled "Looking Forward" she begins: "AAUW is greeting 2017 with an iron will. The presidential campaign and its aftermath have raised some alarming concerns with respect to women and girls and AAUW is one of the nonpartisan voices in what is otherwise a maelstrom of partisan strife." The article titled "The Political Road Ahead" details AAUW's 12-step program for these uncharted political waters and reveals the strategy. We highly recommend that you read the winter 2017 edition from cover to cover, if you have not already done so. To whet your appetite, here are main ideas detailed in the 12-step program:

- 1. Begin as we mean to proceed.
- 2. Remember that personnel is policy.
- 3. Hold their feet to the fire and remain nonpartisan.
- 4. Understand that facts do matter.
- 5. Be an ally in the fight against hate.
- 6. Stand up to everyday sexism whenever you can.
- 7. Support women leaders.
- 8. Never forget that voting rights and fair representation are fundamental to our democracy.
- 9. Recruit a friend (or five!) to subscribe to the AAUW Action Network and help ensure that our message is heard at every level of government.
- 10. Help build our AAUW community by recruiting new members.
- 11. Work locally as well as nationally.
- 12. Keep in mind that the more things change, the more they remain the same.

Happy reading. Keep yourself educated and let your voice be heard.

Games Night is open to all members. Please call the hostess at least 3 days in advance to let her know you are coming.




