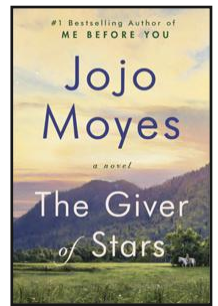
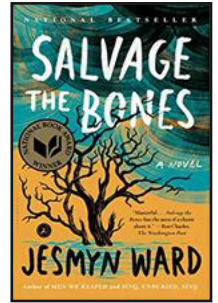
There will be no book discussion in November or December. Our next meeting will be January 23 at Ada Liggett's home. Time TBD

January Book: *Salvage the Bones* by Jesmyn Ward

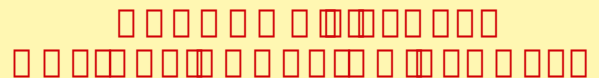
It is a story about southern black culture prior to and during a major hurricane. I read it for another book group and found the discussion lively. Written by a black author. Not too long so people could finish it in time.
