# Carol Brown: Success for a Long-Delayed Dream by Dorothy Quinn


It is not necessarily the exciting adventures, the culmination of interesting and unusual experiences that make someone notable, but rather the strength, courage and determination that one demonstrates as they carve a path of their life. Those characteristics are the ones that drew me to Carol Brown. In fact, I may add humility to that list! When I invited her to be *The Advance's* next subject, she hesitated, responding that she had quite an ordinary life, and rather boring. I felt differently and persuaded her to accept the invitation.



Carol did not have a straight and direct path to realize her dreams, but one that criss-crossed the nation and roles as mother, student, bread-winner and wife. Born in San Diego in a naval base hospital, she left the West Coast at the age of 4 with her mother and sister for a rural town

outside Detroit, Michigan. Then again at 16, her family made another move to Florida where she graduated high school with a dream to become a nurse.

Life and love had other plans and she married and gave birth to a daughter. She worked with a general practitioner and learned many nursing skills which helped in caring for her daughter. After a divorce, in an effort to make a new start. Carol and her

daughter returned to Michigan where she once again married. Returning to work, she felt fortunate to work for a group of psychiatrists who were doing their residency at Michigan State and the University of Michigan. This stirred her interest in psychiatry. It was at this time her desire to get an education stirred. It was also the 70s and women began asserting their right

to equality. Carol started taking business courses. Unfortunately, motherhood and financial needs took priority and Carol needed to halt her goals, albeit temporarily.

in 1982 life forced her to make another turn. Recently divorced, she returned to Florida with her daughter since it was there she felt most at home and a good place to put her life back together. She decided to enroll in school. Carol picked up where she left off in Michigan taking business courses. Returning to work, she found employment in a real estate division of a company which prompted her to obtain a real estate associate license and then worked for a realty company. It was impossible for her to continue her studies with motherhood, career and a new husband so course work came to a halt. Carol's life was interrupted once more by the death of her husband. Since her daughter had married and started her own family in New Jersey, she persuaded her mother to come and live with her. Realizing there was nothing left in Florida, Carol came North and resettled.

Since Carol was free to focus on herself and her delayed dreams, she returned to school. After so many years and so many twists and turns, she graduated in 2019 with honors and recognition from Phi Theta and the






