TREASURER'S NOTE

At our recent Board meeting, the Greater Wayne annual dues were discussed. Here is an overview of the details.

She received her BA at California State University and her MS in Speech/Language Pathology at West Virginia University. That career was wellsuited to not only an articulate woman, but also a nurturing and lifegiving guide to many of the challenged children with whom she worked. Notwithstanding her career accomplishments, she will best be remembered as a friend. She always gave an attentive ear to anyone she spoke with and had a secret knack of returning compliments and surprising deeds when one of her many friends

Linda Nardone, Ph.D.: I am a 32- year resident of Wayne, having moved here upon marrying my second husband Robert. Between us we have 4 children, all of whom attended the Wayne schools, and 5 grandchildren.

My academic career includes receiving a B.S. degree from Fairleigh Dickinson University, a M.S. and Ph.D. degree from Pennsylvania State University, post-doctoral research, and Teaching and Research faculty appointments at Yale University School of Medicine and New York Medical College. Following my academic career, I enjoyed a lengthy pharmaceutical career. I was a founding member of 2 biotechnology start-up companies (still in existence) and held high-ranking executive positions (Vice President, Chief Scientific Officer, General Manager, and Chief Operating Officer) of start-up, small, mid and large sized companies. I am essentially retired but still hold a Chief Regulatory Officer position in another start up biotechnology company.

During my academic and pharmaceutical career, I secured grant funding from National Institutes of Health, Private Foundations, and Department of Defense. I have been on Scientific Advisory Boards, the most recent of which was the Fairleigh Dickinson University School of Pharmacy (as a founding board from 2010-2017). I have had peer reviewed articles

and abstracts published and was the first book editor of "Fundamentals of Regulatory Affairs".

At this point I spend most of my involvement in the community. I have been a founder or leader of 4 not-for-profit entities in the animal care field over the last 30 years and participated in the



founding and operation of a mobile surgical suite for spay/neuter of dogs and cats. I am currently President of the Board of People For Animals, a large not-for profit entity for affordable animal care.

I have been a lector at Immaculate Heart of May for the last ten years. I have served on the Wayne Environmental Commission in 2019-2020 and have been active in community outreach during the COVID-19 pandemic, including volunteering at the Passaic County COVID-19 testing site at the William Paterson site.

I look forward to meeting other university-related women and the encouragement of other women in their dreams.
